OUTREACH OF THE MONTH - BREAKING THE CHAINS

You have probably heard us pray for Breaking the Chains in our "Prayers of the people," but do you know what it is? Breaking the Chains Church (BtCC) is a church inside the Milwaukee Felmers Chaney Correctional Center and the Kenosha Correctional Center, both are pre-release centers helping incarcerated persons return successfully to their families and communities. Bible Study and a Eucharist Worship take place weekly. Congregational volunteers from around the Synod join the men for these gatherings.

How can we help?

Pray—Pray for the men who are about to come out of Felmers Chaney and the Kenosha Correctional Center, that they can adjust to life outside and find the support and connection they need. Pray for those who are currently out and still looking for housing or struggling in other ways. Prayers of thanks for the men offering the abundance of their garden to area food pantries.

Give—Pr. David Rebey will be with us in worship on August 25. We will have a Noisy Offering that day to support the work of Breaking the Chains.

Encourage—we will have a chance during coffee hour to talk more with Pastor Rebey as well as write notes of encouragement to the men who worship with Breaking the Chains. Please plan to stay!

Interested in becoming even more involved? There is a lengthy but not too burdensome training and security clearance required to be able to go inside prison for worship. HOME COMMUNION & HOSPITAL VISITATION TRAINING



Monday, August 26th, 6:30-8:30 pm

We are thrilled to re-launch the Home Communion ministry team again! This team will, once a month, take communion to members who have a difficult time getting to church. It's a real extension of our ministry outside of our walls, and a blessing for everyone who participates. In addition, we are preparing a few people to provide hospital-visit back-up in the event that I am sick or out of town and unable to visit someone. If you have questions about what this involves, please reach out-I'm happy to talk with you about it!

The training will include a discussion of the theology of care, presence and communion, as well as covering the logistics of the visits, scheduling and even a little practice role-play. From 8:00-8:30,

those who ALSO want to be part of the hospital visitation team will stay for some additional preparation for these visits.
