- Learn about Creation: Colleen Resendiz of the Metro Audubon Society will lead us on a Bird Walk, Saturday, Sept 14. Meet at Wehr Nature Center, 8 am. Bring binoculars if you have them and \$5 for parking (if you aren't a member of Wehr). Birding beginners especially welcome!
- 3. Help Restore the Land: Saturday Sept 21, 9 am-noon. Our Outreach of the Month is to help with removal of invasive species in Grobschmidt Park (35th and College). This nature preserve is home to several endangered or threatened species, and our help will be greatly appreciated! There will be some field education in learning how to identify certain plants, as well as understanding the harm of the invasives to the local ecology.
