GREETINGS FROM PASTOR MONTE

Everywhere I go, I hear people who are tired of the upcoming election and concerned about our country's future. Does our faith have anything to say to us in the midst of election stress? YES!

- 1. We are to pray for, work for, pray for and vote for the well-being of the places where we live, as Jeremiah 29:7 reminds us: "But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare." Voting is a privilege and a responsibility—make a plan for how you will vote!
- 2. When we feel anxious about ANYTHING—elections, health, family or job stress—we can bring it to God! Philippians 4:6-7 reminds us: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."
- 3. How we treat each other matters—even those we disagree with vehemently. Jesus tells us to pray for our enemies (*Matthew 5:44-45*) and John reminds us that **Christians should be known by their love** (*John 13:35*). I continue to urge you to pray for the candidate you aren't voting for, and pray for their supporters too!


Have You Noticed?
